The Stewardship Committee informally includes Ty and Ann as co-chairs, and we have met on the phone as he holds out in Ohio, for now. Carolyn Homra and Peggy Barnes have agreed to be on the committee. Carolyn and I have met in person several times to discuss Stewardship. Jennifer Reda is an unofficial advisor to the committee, having volunteered her experience from chairing this last year. Martie has been informed regarding bulletins and timing.

Here is where we are:

- 1. Theme: Dreaming for the Future, from Jeremiah 29:11. "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope."
- 2. Ty has prepared Prayers of the People for this theme, and Martie has already incorporated them into the bulletins. He has also prepared (or is preparing) the Stewardship letter. Stewardship "packets" with the forms are pretty much ready.
- 3. We will use 3 Sundays for Stewardship purposes. They will be 11/3, 11/10, 11/17, and in-gathering 11/24.
- 4. We are lining up speakers for each of the weeks. Two are already on board.
- 5. Themes for each of the three weeks are something like:

Week 1 is about appreciating what we have, including each other, all the ministers in our midst (that's us) and having the communal comfort of knowing we can "put something down" (ex., a ministry long held) when we find ourselves called to another, because we are deep in gratitude that expresses itself in others "picking it up."

Week 2 is about "picking things up," re ministries, while balancing our "new lives" with a "new spiritual leader." We don't need to look in the rear-view mirror. We are looking forward, with gratitude and energy and love for our church, and looking to grow spiritually as individuals and corporately.

Week 3 will be more focused on how this is a precious and critical time, working on our individual and communal stewardship as we prepare for a successful transition with new leadership. Using our Holy Cow consulting results, we want to make sure we look at ourselves honestly and with renewed energy to really be who we want ourselves and think ourselves to be, as a congregation, as we look to attract the right fit of the person looking to be our priest.

We approved \$2500 to Community Housing Coalition and \$2500 to Beacon of Hope, these are the two organizations that will be working for the long run in our community and need our help right now. We also approved \$1,000 in gas gift cards to go to those who are volunteering down in Marshall (many service workers who lost their jobs are working to rebuild).

Sam Shiver said that he had someone who was also writing two \$2500 checks to CHC and BOH. Neighbors in Need offices were destroyed in the flood.

Our Dec 7th event should fund CHC and Beacon of Hope- NIN will probably not do a food pantry again

(BOH does it every day) and if they can find an office in the future, they will only do fuel assistance-but that could be weeks/ months away. If they get up and running sooner than later, we can always fund them in future.

We also discussed yesterday moving forward with the Dec 7<sup>th</sup> fundraising, but not charging for food, inviting folks to come for cup of soup-chili and bread and just enjoy the space. Maybe have some music in the sanctuary. Hopefully sell crafts and have the silent auction.

Susan has only a handful of applications for First Sunday. She'll bring that list to our Oct 20th meeting. One idea is we fund next year on a quarterly basis- and we focus on Madison County and those who serve Madison

County.
